GRN Expands Team

3BBR FM Proudly Supporting Local Fine Music Concerts

Throughout 2024, 3BBR FM has been busy capturing and sharing a rich tapestry of Fine Music Concerts featuring both local talents and international artists performing across West Gippsland.

Volunteer Recording Engineers Garry Havrillay and Paul Strickland generously dedicated their time to record concerts at three prominent West Gippsland venues: Wesley of Warragul, Yarragon Studio, and the West Gippsland Arts Centre. Among the highlights were three chamber music performances during the Yarragon Studio Winter Feast on August 4th at St Jarleth Catholic Church in Yarragon.

This season alone, 13 concerts have been meticulously recorded and broadcasted in the 3BBR FM Concert Hall every Sunday afternoon at 2 pm. The show, produced and presented by Joseph Baraké, has become a beloved staple for music enthusiasts in the community.

The lineup of performances has been nothing short of spectacular:

- The Gippsland Symphony Orchestra

- The West Gippsland Chorale's 40th Anniversary Concert in April, including a memorable collaboration with the Heidelberg Choral Society Choir in Brahms' Requiem, under the direction of Peter Bandy.

- Genesis Baroque from Melbourne, presenting four Paris Quartets by Telemann.

- The Melbourne Chamber Orchestra, enchanting audiences with Schubert's Trout Quintet.

- Munich-based pianist Michael Leslie and international saxophonist Niels Bijl, the creative force behind Yarragon Studio's house concerts and festival.

- Local luminaries like pianist Brian Chapman, violinist Susan Pierotti, cellist Rosanne Hunt, and Zoe Knighton paying homage to Schubert.

- Melbourne pianists Ronan Apcar and Joshua Hooke.
- The Brisbane-based Contra Guitar Duo.
- Duo Kneale-Yaun performing captivating works for bassoon and piano.
- The Cane Ensemble featuring Eliza Shepard on flute, Niels Bijl on saxophone, and Adam McMillan on piano.

Recording these diverse performances not only allows concert-goers to relive these magical moments but also highlights the exceptional quality of Fine Music being regularly showcased in our region. President's Prattle



Behind the scenes at our station, a multitude of tasks, big and small, keep us on air and engaged with our community.

Programming is a constant process of fine-tuning to ensure the sound continues. This includes scheduling, loading announcements, and adjusting for presenter absences, alongside maintaining equipment and

updating our website. These responsibilities generate a steady stream of administrative tasks that are essential to our operation.

As unpaid volunteers, we rely on your support to keep everything running smoothly. Your involvement, no matter how small, helps prevent burnout and ensures we can continue delivering quality programming. If you or someone you know is looking for a fulfilling role—whether in the studio or from home—now is an opportune time to get involved. We have vacancies to fill, including upcoming board positions like Garry Havrillay's at the next AGM.

In recent months, we've adjusted our schedule to introduce new programs, aiming to create a seamless listening experience that appeals to a wider audience. Your feedback on our music and programming preferences is invaluable, though sometimes challenging to reconcile with practical constraints and availability.

Infrastructure challenges, such as frequent power outages, have prompted us to overhaul our backup systems. Thanks to the efforts of Ian Hill and Garry Havrillay, our transmission can now continue for up to 10 hours on battery during outages. However, increasing outage durations at our transmitter site necessitate the installation of an on-site generator—a critical investment in maintaining uninterrupted service. Additional backup enhancements at the studio are also under consideration, albeit at significant expense.

Moreover, our main transmitter has exhibited faults, requiring us to rely on our backup unit. We're exploring repair options, but it's likely we'll need to budget for a replacement exceeding \$10,000.

These ongoing operational challenges highlight the need for sustained fundraising efforts. Beyond annual fees, your support in securing sponsors and encouraging new memberships is vital to our financial stability.

Earlier this year, flooding from a plumbing failure caused significant disruption and unexpected expenses in our studios. Prompt assistance from Baw Baw Shire building staff helped mitigate the impact, and we appreciate their ongoing support.

Looking ahead, we're evaluating an offer for a new, potentially more cost-effective news service with a stronger Victorian focus from a more commercial provider. What do you think? In conclusion, our station thrives on community involvement and support. These guidelines enable us to broadcast articles without seeking prior permission from authors, ensuring our broadcasts remain accessible to all. We emphasize proper accreditation by acknowledging sources and authors during broadcasts. In cases where we encounter poorly written text, we responsibly paraphrase or clarify without altering the original intent, maintaining the integrity of the content.

Our commitment to these protocols underscores our dedication to providing accurate and respectful news coverage to our listeners across Gippsland. As we continue to grow and adapt, GRN remains steadfast in our mission to serve the community with integrity and excellence in journalism.
